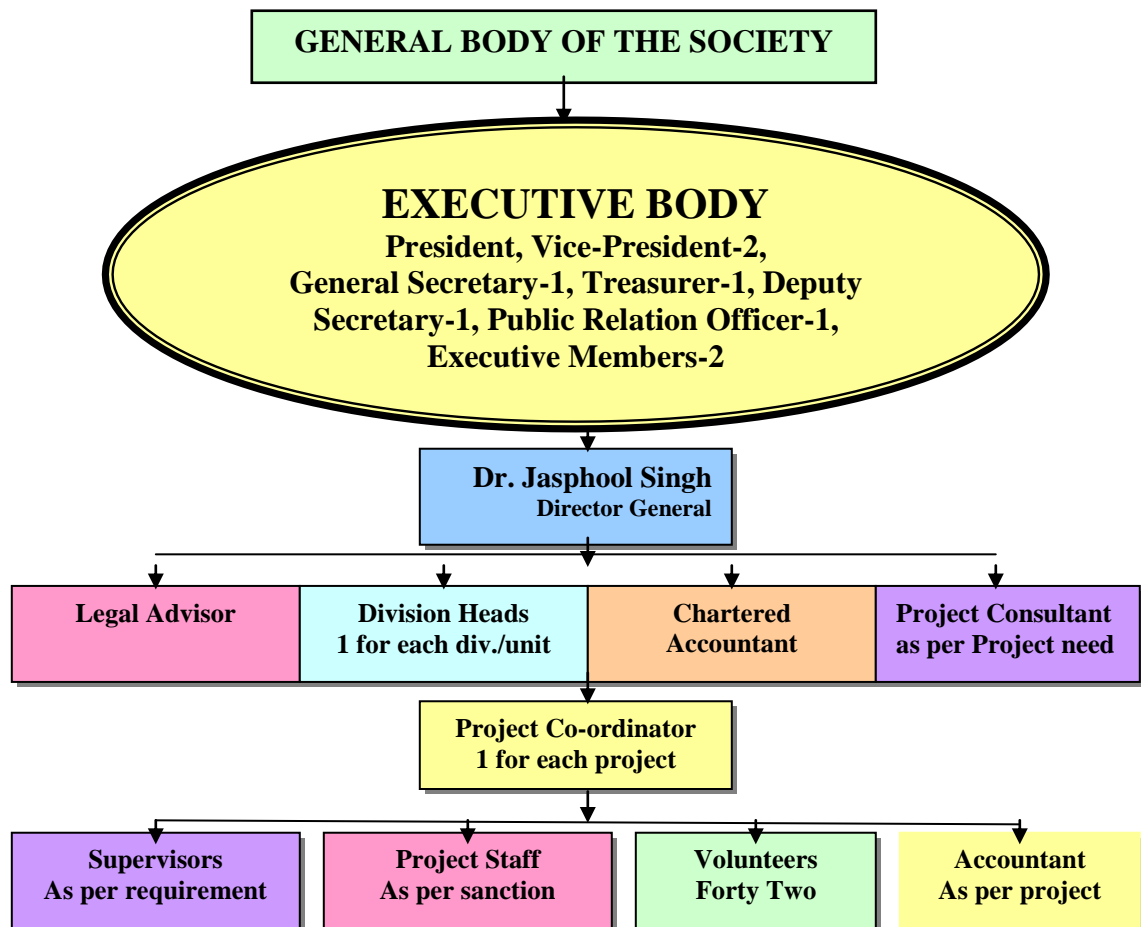

FIELD PROGRAMMES

HEALTH CENTRE

Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam, Rohtak has been running a Health Centre at Urban Slum viz. Kachchi Garhi, Rohtak for the last ten years as continued programme. This Health Centre was financially assisted by District Urban Development Agency (DUDA), Rohtak previously. In this health centre, the people almost living Below Poverty Line (BPL) & their families are getting free facilities of Diagnosis, Simple treatment, free Medicines & referral. This Health Centre was inaugurated by the Financial Commissioner & Secretary Sh. M.K. Miglani, IAS. Sh. S.K. Sexena, IAS. Project Director SUDA, Chandigarh also visited this centre and praised the initiative taken by HNYKS. From time to time officers of DUDA & others have been visiting the centre. In the urban slums it is performing well & providing services at their door steps.

RRA FOR NEAC FOR HARYANA

The status of Regional Resource Agency (RRA) to Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam has been continued by Ministry of Environment & Forests, Govt. of India to conduct National Environment Awareness Campaign (NEAC) in whole state of Haryana through small NGOs/institutions/schools. National Environment Awareness Campaign (NEAC) is having objective of creating environmental awareness amongst the masses. NEAC is a decentralized campaign. RRA is responsible for identifying the local environmental problems and central theme for every year. Besides helping the Ministry in selecting participating organizations and HNYKS is also responsible for physically monitoring and evaluating the activities conducted by various organizations under NEAC. In the process, HNYKS received many applications to conduct NEAC for the year 2010-11 on Bio-Diversity Conservation. Summary of the proposal for NEAC 2010-11 was done and presented in Regional Level Workshop for sanctioning & approval of projects. 846 projects of NGOs/Educational Institutions/ Deptts. were approved for conducting NEAC 2010-11.

HANDICRAFT – AHVY

As we are aware that handicrafts activity has been thought as part time activity in rural India where as it is having bright future with big potential with a huge market demand. It will not be out of place to mention here that many artisans spread over the areas are scattered due to unorganized & lack of exposure to market, literacy and new technological advancements/designs besides funds/capital requirements. Identified Artisans of Hand Embroidery, Patch Work, Croshia craft of the target area involved in thrift & credit initiatives, training, leadership development & confidence building besides providing them a platform to making them active entrepreneurs resulting in to establishment of viable & self supporting economic activity. HNYKS is going ahead with multi pronged approach as: Social approach through mobilizing them into SHGs, ID cards issued, Health Insurance, Technological Approach/Intervention through, Marketing Approach/Intervention through, Financial Approach/Intervention through, Infrastructure Approach/Intervention through.

Under directions of **Ministry of Textile**, Govt. of India under A.H.V.Y. **Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam, Rohtak** has organized/conducted 5 Skill Upgradation Training Programmes and 5 Design & Technical Development Workshop in villages **Mokhra, Madina, Lakhnamajra & Kalanaur cluster of Rohtak district**. Declining Child Sex Ratio WPC UNFPA Project

Advisory Committee on Pre-Natal Diagnostic Technique (Regulation and Prevention of Misuse) Act, 1994 has been formulated at District level all over Haryana. HNYKS has been nominated as a member of this District Advisory Committee. Our team visits ultra sound centers of Rohtak from time to time to check-up violation of Act and to ascertain whether prescribed Performa before check-up is filled or not. HNYKS has also been running ***Campaign against Sex Determination and Female Foeticide with several Awareness Generation Programmes by conducting Exhibition of Charts and Relevant Material. Besides community mobilization at village level and sensitization in schools and mobilizing volunteers under an Integrated initiative to combat Declining child sex ratio in Haryana besides conducting State level advocacy through State Level Workshop.***

TI AMRITSAR

Targeted intervention in contest of HIV/AIDS is a set of activities and approaches aimed at reducing the risk of HIV infection among the bridge population truckers' There for HNYKS was sanctioned a project for conducting targeted intervention project (TIP) for bridge population i.e. Trucker's at Amritsar (Punjab). The project mainly have objectives :

- ❑ To increase knowledge about STD/HIV transmission among 10000 Truckers for adoption of safer sexual behavior and practices through B.C.C. strategy.
- ❑ To increase health seeking behavior for reducing the incidence of various sexually transmitted infection among truckers appropriate clinical intervention.
- ❑ To increase the use of condom among target population by improving accessibility and availability, to create enabling environment for sustain ability of the project in the target area and to create and environment that does not create obstacles in safer behavior,
- ❑ To build strong linkages with ICTC for referral and testing services.

Main strategy opted are imparting complete knowledge by IEC and generating awareness on STD/HIV and AIDS to the target population using IEC materiel in one to one/one to group reinforcing BC using audiovisuals, using media, Nukkar Natak etc. and B.C.C (Dialog based peed led interpersonal communication (IPC)), Creative, synchronized and thematic mid - media. Advocacy for behavior change among secondary & external stakeholders through project.

PULSE POLIO CAMPAIGN

We at HNYKS have continued initiative in Pulse Polio Campaign organized by Health Department under guidance of District Administration from time to time. HNYKS has been provided 5 vehicles and volunteers for Organization took keen interest in helping the District Administration for the successful fulfillment of the objective of this Campaign. This year, Prof. D.R. Chaudhary, Chairman & Director General Dr. Jasphool Singh flagged off the vehicles for pulse polio campaign. Volunteers & staff conducted meetings to promote awareness about the worldwide campaign of total eradication of Polio from Haryana/India/World. Polio can definitely be eradicated with joint efforts.

AMBULANCE FOR REFERRAL SERVICES

As HNYKS is running an Ambulance for use for referral services of both Govt. & Private Health Institutions especially in emergency in respect of Women & Child Care (Obstetric & Pediatric Care) round the Clock. Its presence during working hours is ensured at CHC, Sampla & is on call during off working hours. Logbook of ambulance for journeys undertaken from time to time, complete record of journeys & consumption of POL etc. in logbook duly countersigned by SMO have been maintained. Ambulance charges Rs. 4.00 per k.m. Which are utilized for POL & maintenance of ambulance & as remuneration for Driver. Ambulance has been smoothly functioning for the betterment of health of the people.

JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN (JSS)

Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Rohtak, tried its level best with a team of committed & dedicated people to conduct/organise & achieve its well implemented action plan in year 2010-11. We proceed for achievements one by one under various heads :

During the period, JSS imparted Skill Development Training in various trades to 2500 trainees. JSS Rohtak has conducted 11 types of vocational courses under various types of trades comprising 145 batches of 3 Months to Six Months duration. These trainings are imparted to start Income Generating Activities (IGA) to provide them self and sustainable employment besides upgrading their skills. Some of them have also started some IGAs resulting into economic empowerment of trainees and in turn to their families also. This year ***JSS started innovative location i.e. District Jail Rohtak and has imparted trainings in Beauty Culture, Dress Making & Soft Toys making to jail inmates and Jail Authorities have also appreciated the JSS efforts of imparting these vocational trainings to this deprived group of women successfully.***

To expose the inbuilt talents of trainees in particular and masses in general besides making them aware, understand about various aspects of development sector or to promote national goals such as national integration, population and development, women's equality, protection and conservation of environment etc, JSS Rohtak organized a no. of activities such as

SUPPORT TO TRAINING & EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMME FOR WOMEN (STEP)

Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam has been continuing Mushroom Cultivation Project under STEP Scheme of Ministry of Women & Child Development, Govt. of India for Rohtak district having main objective.

"To impart training for upgradation of skills and sustainable employment for women through mushroom action oriented project" Specific objective are :

To provide training for skill up-gradation.

Mobilizing women in small viable groups and facilitating them with access to credit.

Enabling groups of women to take up employment cum-income generation programme of their own.

To provide marketing facility & support services (Health check-ups, crèches and other educational programmes).

Duration of Project is three year starting from 2008. Beneficiaries has been covered 2160 No. women as per yearly targets. As per project implementation beneficiaries have been covered out of 19 villages of Rohtak district which are involved in 200 SHGs. Out of these SHGs, 4 village wise clusters were made comprising 10-13 SHGs each and on federation was also started comprising all 4 clusters and left over are in process. All covered women have been provided Training on Mushroom Cultivation besides organizing Awareness Generation Camps, Sensitization meetings, Exposure visits to HAIC, Murthal & Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Rohtak and Seminar at Meham, Distt. Rohtak etc. The process of mobilization and bank credit linkages etc. is going on. The villages were selected keeping Socio economic and demographic profile as information gathered from primary as well as secondary data. Beneficiaries are also selected from families living below poverty line & schedule & backward classes.

TARGETTED INTERVENTION PROJECT (TIP) ROHTAK

Targeted Intervention in context of HIV/AIDS is a set of Activities and Approaches aimed at reducing the risk of HIV Infection among People who practice high-risk behavior. Therefore, Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam (HNYKS) Project for Conducting **TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT (TIP) FOR CORE GROUP i.e. FSWs/ MSMs AT ROHTAK AND SURROUNDINGS** was continued for another year by HACS, Panchkula.

To bring down the behavior change from high risk to low risk among target group through BCC, Gender Specific Communication Strategy was developed that resulted in development of effective BCC/IEC Material. Apart from that a large no of Material was procured from HACS and distributed as per the need in community.

Distribution of Leaflets/Handouts, posters & stickers were adopted as a regular phenomenon to spread the message. **Counseling** is done by counselor appointed for the purpose. Target group is motivated to adopt health seeking behavior, safe sex practice, proper usage of condoms, treatment-seeking attitude etc. **Inter Personal Communication** (IPC) were made by PE/ORWs. Target Group was motivated for BCC, Health seeking behaviour, Condom Promotion etc. Few among them were referred for STD Treatment. **One-Group Contacts** were held in different high risk areas by our ORWs in which a group of 3-5 & 7-10 persons respectively were motivated to adopt Safe Sexual Practice & Health Seeking Behaviour with Demonstration of Proper Usage of Condom along with distribution of BCC Material & Condom

It was observed that majority of our target group was suffering from one or the other STI problem. But they didn't seek treatment because of carelessness and hesitance. Looking into these, the doctor was selected who have obtained on SCM earlier or have experience of providing STI treatment for providing accessible, acceptable & effective clinical services (**STD treatment**) with distribution of free drugs to the target group. This Treatment was started through Referral Card System on alternate days (two days in a week) at Drop-in-centre. **Health camps** were also organized for Treatment in general and STD treatment in particular. The Health Camps were organized in various sites looking into the number of targeted population. Target group was motivated to adopt Safe Sexual Practice & Health Seeking Behaviour with Demonstration of Proper Usage of Condom along with distribution of BCC Material & Condom. Target Group were also referred to VCTC for HIV testing and treatment.

Drop in center have been made functional throughout Where MSM & FSWs sitting there and interacts to each others. And they are doing so many cultural activities in drop in center like songs, dance and drama related to HIV/AIDS. Condom act as a barrier in transmission of diseases like STI/HIV/AIDS. Already established **Condom Depots** at various strategic locations were refilled regularly. The availability and accessibility of condoms were ensured through these depots. We procured both kinds of **condoms** i.e. free and socially marketed from the Health Department and promoted those as per the need. During interactions, information regarding other condoms available in the market like dotted, flavoured, striped, and scented was also given to the target group who needed/requested.

Volunteers/peer educators formed from the community to increase the level of knowledge about HIV/STD/AIDS

Advocacy workshop also organized during the process Member representatives of different NGO's Govt. officials, ex-army persons and police personnel's. A good representation of females were also observed during the workshop. Networking with

Haryana State AIDS Control Society, District Health Officials, other NGO's working in the target area along with advocacy at micro and macro level. Funds provided to meet the immediate needs of the targeted population group who needed/requested.

Community events/Important Days were organized/celebrated to influence Community Influencers to support PEs & ORWs supported by Lecture on HIV/AIDS, etc. IEC Material was distributed. **World AIDS Day** was celebrated In the Project office with the Global theme. Apart from usual celebrations this time we had a thought of doing something new and innovative.

Self Help Groups were also formulated from different target groups. They are in initial stages. No formal trainings for them have been conducted. These groups would share and advocate their issues in different forums.

Staff Meetings were regularized besides doing once in a month, meetings were organized on every Saturday to solve out all field problems and share the progress of the projects besides reviewing the process adopted by experience sharing.

TRAINING PE ORWS-TI

Under the guidance and support from Haryana & Punjab State AIDS Control Society (H/PSACS) and State Training Resource Centre (STRC), Chandigarh HNYKS has organized Four Days Training Programme for Peer Educators (PE) at Rohtak & Amritsar on the issues related to HIV/AIDS, Field Mobilization, Condom Promotion, BCC, Enabling Environment and STD Treatment and Regular Medical Check-up (RMC). Issues were delivered by Project Manager, Doctor, and Representatives of HSACS & STRC. They were also well aware on their role & responsibilities, mapping of the area, formats of reporting. They all were also involved in practical aspects of the issue and linkages with ICTC, Community Care Centre and other facilities. This training will definitely help to effectively & efficiently implementation of TIs in their respective hot spots or sites.

DAY CARE CENTRE FOR THE AGED

Processes of modernization and technological changes have brought about a vast change in the life-style of the people. The health care initiatives have increased the life span of the aged, thus leaving a lot of spare time at their disposal. To tap the pool of experience of elders for social development and to provide platform of interaction to the aged Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam has been running 2 Day Care Centers for the aged (for Female) at Village Kishangarh & Siman, Distt. Rohtak for the last 17 years.

The centers provide Nutrition, Health Services, Outing/visiting, Outdoor & Indoor Games, Counselling and other facilities to more than 60 aged in each center. Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, is supporting Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam for running these Day Care Centers for the Aged.

SWADHAR

Continuing our efforts into women empowerment and services to them. We have been running the project "Swadhar" Shelter Home for the destitute under sanction from Ministry of Women & Child Development. Swadhar home is successfully running at Meham and all staff is performing their duties accordingly. Apart from daily needs of food, shelter, security rendered to the Swadhar beneficiaries. Beneficiaries across all the sections of the society specially SC, BPL, destitute, widows were given special attention. Children's & kids of these beneficiaries were also taken care in the home and a family atmosphere was created so that they will not get a feeling of deprived. Several Officers of State & District including Block visited many times to inspect the home. Swadhar inmates also visited Haridwar & Rishikesh to take a holy dip in Ganga.

CONCURRENT EVALUATION UNDER NRHM

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, GOI has selected HNYKS as filed agency for Haryana State to conduct concurrent Evaluation under NRHM, Round – I (including supplementary Round – 1) All 5 districts field work and data collection work has been completed and Tables are generated for elaborative explanation. Computer feeding work has been successfully completed and Fact Sheet for Haryana State has been generated which are accepted. Now process of Reports writing is going at Zonal agency level under supervision of International Institute of Population Sciences, Mumbai.

SHG FORMATION UNDER SGSY SCHEME

Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam has been engaged by DRDA, Rohtak to formulate & promote Self Help Groups under Swaran Jyanti Gram Swa-Rojgar Yojana- SGSY. HNYKS has been formulating Self Help Groups of 10-20 suitable BPL families of concerned villages after that initial training to group functionaries i.e. President, Secretary & Treasurer. HNYKS is facilitating to opening of bank accounts. All SGSY Scheme & SHG concept has been told & make them unable to perform all functions. As a result in Rohtak district, HNYKS team has formulated more than 300 SHGs out of which HNYKS has facilitated 280 SHGs to open their Bank Accounts. The process of monthly/Fortnightly meeting of SHGs in going on & some of groups has started interloaning also. Groups have also attained First Grading, Second Grading etc.

SPECIAL PROJECT UNDER SGSY

HNYKS has started implementation of special project under SGSY on Sustainable Agriculture Development by adopting Vermi Culture in Jhajjar distt. with financial assistance from DRDA. Jhajjar. 35 Villages were initially covered & 35 SHGS from BPL families were mobilized to opt vermi culture as IGA. Necessary efforts were initiated by Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam (HNYKS) for Awareness/ Popularization activities in three blocks initially which are Jhajjar, Bahadurgarh & Beri. Secondly after these awareness, people of BPL community were mobilized into Self Help Groups to take up IGA of Vermi Culture. First of all we have mobilized the SHGs members to provide land for establishment of Vermi Culture Units. In five villages namely Kheri Sultan, Bajitpur, Mandothi, Bhadani and Dabhoda, we have established Vermi Cultuire Units. Animal Dung and Worms has also been dumped. Worms are also put in for culture and side by side motivation is also in process. Seven Self help groups have been mobilized to open their group accounts and they have been mobilized for saving habit and others are in process. Side by side about recently completed Vermiculture units, we have contacted them and started all SHG members mobilization to revive these in two of them namely

village Khajpur, Bahujholri necessary animal dung has been dumped and worms has been provided in Khajpur and others are in progress in another units mobilized process is going on and it seems to be having need to be repaired some or to be established again as new cases. In future, Established units and recently completed Vermiculture units will be revived and production in some of units will be started accordingly to create peer pressure among left over SHGs besides others will be mobilized to establish Vermi culture Units in villages besides production will be provided marketing and purchase

CULTURAL PROGRAMMES

Cultural pollution is creating very big problem to our youngsters, hence, to conserve the local heritage and maintaining the regional folk core in the area, HNYKS has continued Cultural Programme as one the major thrust area. These cultural Programmes were organized for both rural as well as urban people. During the year HNYKS has organized

Cultural Activities/Programmes in community to preserve cultural heritage. Various cultural programmes were conducted on the eve of Sankrant Utsav, Holi, Haryana Day & Teej Utsav, Vaishakhi etc. In these programmes Folk songs, Folk dances and Haryanavi

skits on Social evils to aware the masses were conducted. Along with these some competitions like debate, Mehandi Competitions too were organized during the whole year. Our women beneficiaries & trainees successfully participated and shown their talents also in local folk also. Successful participants were given prizes with certificates.

WELFARE OF AGED-MMU, DCC

Besides running DCC Day Care Centre for Aged we are also supposed to run MMU and other welfare activities for the aged persons like Training to care givers and other related initiatives to make them respectable and have respect. In the series, we have been in process to implement/running DCC at Morkheri, Jhajjar, Training of Caregivers at Rohtak, RRTC etc. These proposed project will definitely provide a rightful & prestigious directions with platform or enables environment to successfully cover their second inning or live respected life as well.

DRUG DE-ADDICTION

Aside from its already high cost of living and economy, illicit drug users in India has come to represent yet another danger over past decade. Drug abusing population is increasing day by day. Many surveys were conducted regarding this problem. It has been estimated that between 22 to 66% were poly drug users and about 16-49% were illiterate who live in rural areas. Hence HNYKS has observed International Day against Drug Abuse and Trafficking on 26th June, 2010 to make aware the general masses about ill effects of drug use and prevailing unusual habits. Side by side HNYKS is proposing to run Drug-de-addiction Centre to over come this major problem for prevention of Alcoholism and substance drug abuse. This centre will also improve the services in drug demand reduction and develop adequate environment for better living.

CONSUMER RIGHTS AWARENESS

In modern age to make the general community aware about their rights as a consumer, HNYKS organized many programmes on the theme and different knowledgeable Resource Persons delivered lectures through participatory approach. The Organization also observed the Consumer Rights Day. The people were motivated to receive bills of every item of purchase & all shopkeepers/businessmen must issue bills after each & every sale so that confidence may be built up between both & healthy business practice may develop.

ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Improvement in road conditions and craze for fast driving causes rapid growth in accident cases on different Highways/Roads, Seeing the alarming situation, HNYKS

organized programme to create awareness about **Safe Driving** and **Traffic Rules** with the help of pamphlets, Leaflets etc. General people were also made aware about Road Crossing System and safe habits of Traveling/Driving. The students of various schools were included in this awareness programme to motivate the general masses. **“Speed Thrills But Kills & Always Alert Avoid Accident”** write-ups were also used to develop road safety habit in the community.

SPORTS PROGRAMME

HNYKS has been putting its efforts to orient our young boys and girls toward healthy practice of sports. Hence HNYKS has conducted many sports programmes. This year special attention was given to the women of rural areas, for whom we organized Matka Race, Boris Race, Three Leg Race, 50 Meter and 100 Meter Race. Prizes were distributed to encourage the participants and Lectures were delivered by Hon able guest speakers regarding importance of games for healthy life. Youth were motivated to take to sports as a daily habit to look healthy, feel healthy & work healthy.

SC VOCATIONAL TRAINING

HNYKS has initiated SC Vocational Training in various trades so that SC community can get benefit exclusively of the vocation training programme and learn skills and can start their own income generating activity or do job at any shop/enterprise and earn money to maintain and betterment of their living standard.

INCOME GENERATION PROGRAMME

The various programmes undertaken by the organization with support from the Govt. and the Non-government agencies have always demanded financial contribution to the projects from the organization. Being a non-profit making body, the organization was largely dependent on donations and contributions from various sources. To bring in regular inflow of finances for contribution to the ongoing programme. HNYKS has established a Computer Training Centre where HNYKS provides training in Computer Applications by charging fees. The receipt from fees is spent on the projects as organizational contribution and general office expenses. HNYKS organized cultural programmes also to generate income besides, also provides consultancy for Project formulation, Management, Review & Training etc. in development sector.

MICRO FINANCE

As HNYKS has been involved in micro finance activities in which HNYKS provides soft loan of Rs. 10000/- to 20,000/- to Women SHGs and individual women SHG members for a period of one year or so as per need & circumstances to start up the means of self-employment or income generating activity at nominal rate of interest and formality of documents for applying is normal not so lengthy like other micro financing institutions. It will not be out of place to mention here that no guarantee/security is taken while lending loan. Rebate is also provided in case of timely repayment of loan amount. In some genuine cases after approval of governing body of HNYKS, concession in repaying loan amount may be provided. In future we will try to link up HNYKS with financial institutions so that amount of loan and period of repayment to individuals and groups may be enhanced to set up functional income generating units.

GARIMA

While the PCPNDT Act, PCM Act and PWDV Act have been in place for a long time, their implementation remains poor on account of the low priority given to women's issues by the administration at all levels, thus impeding efforts to combat and eradicate Gender Based Violence in India. There is a need for proper allocation of resources for creating

infrastructure for the implementation of the acts. Through the Garima project, efforts has been made to advocate with the government within a focused time bound plan on the actions/interventions required to effectively implement the PCPNDT Act, PWDV Act, PCM Act and recognizing Gender Based Violence as a Health Issue. Garima aims to ensure that women's issues become an integral part of all policy planning in India and that women's health and socio-economic rights are protected and promoted. The activities has been carried out under Garima for Haryana were State level meeting was organized and campaigning Advocacy on the status of implementation of the PCPNDT Act, PWDV Act and PCM Act. One to one meetings with policy makers (MPs, MLAs, Senior Bureaucrats etc.

WPC_BLS

While implementing an integrated initiative to combat declining child Sex Ratio in Haryana, a base line survey (BLS) of Households of 50 villages of Rohtak district was conducted to capture birth, death and marriage registration details. Each household in every targeted village was covered in this survey. Reference period was one year from is 1st June, 2009 to 31st May, 2010 in three provided formats. More than 40000 households were covered.

IL&FS_PPTCT

As one in the eleven persons of those who became infected with HIV in year 2000 was a child. HIV can be transmitted during pregnancy especially in the last trimester, during child birth, or breastfeeding. HIV infection is no longer restricted to the core groups practicing unsafe behaviour but also is establishing itself in general population. Although currently, India has a overall low prevalence of HIV among pregnant women in many parts of the country, with the progression of epidemic in general population it is bound to rise in women in reproductive age group and thereby increasing chances of MTCT of HIV infection. Therefore, Global Fund to Fight AIDS Tuberculosis and Malaria (GFATM) RCC-2 has been in to prevent HIV transmission and mitigate the impact of HIV by expanding access to testing, counselling and prevention of parent to child transmission services, strengthening inter program linkages, especially HIV and TB collaboration and integrating HIV services with general health system performing various related activities. "Principal Recipient" IL&FS Education of GFATM RCC-2 has nominated Haryana Nav Yuvak Kala Sangam (HNYKS), Rohtak to conduct this Prevention of Mother To Child Transmission of HIV/AIDS (PMTCT) programme in Rohtak District. In this personnels are working in Rohtak District in respective PGIMS/GH/CHC areas. The monthly data of HIV tested pregnant women and other counseling services is taken from respective ICTCs. Community Mobilization events are also being organized in the series on the issue.

PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS

BY recognizing the work of HNYKS, Universities and other institutions are sending their students for field placement in our organization. This year following were came for placement :

- ❑ Students of Post Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM) of XIME, Bangalore undergone 20 Days Socially Useful & Productive Activity (SUPA).
- ❑ Student of 3rd Semester of Department of Social Work, BPSM University, Khanpur Kalan were placed in our organization for Concurrent Field Work for six months.
